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The Director of School Education, Hyderabad is informed that based on his proposal Government in Memo. 3rd cited have issued instructions that the SC/ST candidates who were appointed as SGTs in the SC/ST category in pursuance of G.O.Ms.No.223, Education, dated 1-7-1989 without possessing TTC qualification during 1989 are entitled for Notional Increments from the date of their appointment as SGT till they acquire TTC qualification and the monetary benefit shall be allowed from the day following the last day of acquiring TTC qualification.

2. On the further clarification sought by the Director of State Audit, the Government in the reference 5<sup>th</sup> cited informed that the recruitment was made to the post of teachers through S.C. in June, 1989 and August, 1989 and the applicants who were selected to the post of Special Teachers but not for the regular S.G.Ts are not eligible for granting the time scale of pay of Rs.1010-1800 from the date of their initial appointment.

3. Government have further examined the matter in detail and observe that the orders issued in G.O.Ms. No.302, Education, dated: 10-7-1986 are with regard to opening up of Primary Schools in School-less habitations and posting of trained / un-trained teachers belonging to Scheduled Tribe community. The G.O. has been issued specifically keeping in view the tribal villages which are school-less. In that particular context, wherever local tribals are appointed even if they are failed candidates, they can be given regular scale of pay. This cannot be extended to whatever are the subsequent recruitments done through constitution of regular DSCs from time to time. There is no way those vacancies can be shown as backlog vacancies, to be filled up as part of the regular DSC extending them the scale of pay. Whoever is recruited, whether he belong to OC, SC or ST category as per the relevant DSC, 1989 or otherwise will be governed by the conditions of such appointment, whereas the recruitment is made giving them Rs.3987- for a period of 2 years and after that a regular scale of pay. Government cannot extend the scale of pay to SC / ST candidates recruited under the regular DSCs extending them the provisions of G.O.Ms.No.302.
